FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

Spring is a good time to do some planning - planning a garden, planning a trip, etc. The city is also doing some planning right now. In addition to the regular seasonal planning, we are also in the midst of some bigger, special planning projects:

- Comprehensive Plan Update (which is long overdue) – this process started in late 2020 with the Plan Commission helping to guide it. Public input is incorporated into this process and there will be multiple opportunities to participate.
- Bayfield Street Highway Project (scheduled to begin in 2024) – initial planning for Phase 1 of this process has begun and more opportunities for public input will be coming soon.

Most recently, we've launched a Community Branding process in cooperation with the Washburn Area Chamber of Commerce and the Washburn Business Alliance. Led by staff and researchers from the UW-Madison Division of Extension, this process will help Washburn define its identity and make it easier for us to show the world what a great place this is to live, work and play.

Washburn has a lot going for it and instead of describing it as "the town you drive through on the way to Bayfield," we will be able to use common language to describe our community and what makes it unique and special. Please share your input by filling out the survey:

Yard Waste Site

The City's yard waste disposal site will be open on the following days and times in 2021.

Saturdays, April 10, 17 & 24. 9:00 am - 1:00 pm

Beginning May 1 - November 6, 2021

Wednesdays	2:00 pm - 6:00 pm
Saturdays	9:00 am - 1:00 pm

Acceptable yard waste materials to be disposed:

- Lawn and garden clippings
- Leaves, brush and small branches
- Tree limbs 6" in diameter or less must be in 10 foot lengths or shorter
- Tree limbs 6" to 12" in diameter must be in 6 foot lengths or shorter.
