It's Important to Have Goals

It's also important to check in on your progress on those goals periodically. The City Council sets goals at the beginning of each year. They are posted on the website under "City Government/Agendas & Minutes" before the City Council agendas.

Here is a list of the 2022 Goals/Projects with a brief update on each one:

- Bayfield Street Reconstruction we are on schedule for Phase 1 planning and beginning planning for Phase 2
- Ambulance Staffing Interviews are scheduled, and we are expecting to have 2 EMTs begin work in January.
- Brokedown This project is taking longer than anticipated. Next steps to be determined.
- Sewer Line Reroute This work has been completed. In addition to allowing the Iron Works to proceed with an expansion, this project now provides better circulation of water as well as a water source for the ballfields and skating rink.
- West End Park Campground Expansion Planning We are in the midst of this.
- Comprehensive Plan The Plan Commission is making good progress on this.
- Sidewalks Still hoping to have an inventory completed before snow season.
