Call to Order

Meeting was called to order at 5:33 pm by Maziasz. 5 members present.

Introductions

Angel Croll is joining the Parks Committee and introduced herself. Other members introduced themselves as well.

Approval of the July 21, 2020 Parks Committee Meeting Minutes

Motion made to approve minutes by Cook, second by Bartnick. Motion carried unanimously and minutes were approved.

Updates from Public Works Department

Janisch gave update.

- A new public works director has been hired and will start November 2.
- Campgrounds are still full, even mid-week. Some people had to be turned away. There have been a few incidences of people taking other people's sites despite a reservation tag being posted.
- West End Dock update a change was made to the contract as additional sheeting will be added to
 extend it along the shoreline. Pearl Beach Construction Company has been doing the work.
- The dirt for the ball field has arrived, and there is a volunteer to spread it. The dugout is still not installed and Cook is coordinating this.
- The installation of the informational kiosk at Wikdal Park has begun.
- A potteryfest in Wikdal Park is still scheduled for September 5.
- A commercial use permit was issued to the kayak outfitter in town.

Update on Implementation of the Walking Trail Land Management Plan

Janisch reported a few things:

- More garden valerian (an invasive plant) was removed.
- The Northwoods Cooperative Weed Management Area will be helping to remove buckthorn and honeysuckle in a few areas including near the coal dock. Lang stressed the importance of treating the cut stump with herbicide as this is a much more effective control technique as only cutting will lead to re-sprouting.
- Wisconsin Coastal Management Program has requested that the City fill out a questionnaire as NOAA (the funder) needs more info before releasing the funds. Lang will help Janisch work on this.
 - Maziasz reported that there may be leafy spurge across from the skating rink.

Update & Action on Dog Park

At the last Parks committee meeting, Cook volunteered to follow-up with the dog park group about next steps and speaking to landowners adjacent to Area 4 of the lakeshore walking trail area. Cook followed up with the main people of that group. They think that City staff or the Parks committee should send a letter to adjacent

landowners, rather than the dog park group send a letter. The two main people of the dog park group also stated that people are losing interest, and some supporters thought that people questioned the validity of the survey so a letter from the dog park group may not be well received/respected. After a brief discussion, Parks committee members concluded that it would be best to further consider a dog park when the City and appropriate committees work on the Comprehensive Recreation Plan.

Discussion & Action of Inventorying City Parks

Parks committee members briefly reviewed the evaluation form. They concluded that a different form will need to be developed for campgrounds. So far, Jackie's Field, Hillside Park, and Legion Park have been evaluated. The committee still needs to evaluate Wikdal Park, Thompson's West End Park, Memorial Park, and the Athletic Field area. The Parks committee will meet at Thompson's West End Park pavilion for its September meeting.

<u>Discussion & Action regarding Permitting of Commercial Usage on City Parks</u>

The current ordinance/permit system is specific to kayaking and canoeing uses. City Council members recognize that the City may need a permit for other uses such as ice cave tours, food trucks, etc. Parks committee members agreed that a small group should look into what other nearby/regional cities have done. Cook, Croll, and Maziasz volunteered to work with Janisch and Kluver and report their findings and recommendations to the Parks committee by December 1, 2020. Janisch will provide information regarding what research has already been done.
