Meeting called to order at 5:31 pm by Motiff, attendance as recorded above.

Approval of Minutes – December 16, 2021, Minutes – Motion by Anderson to approve the minutes of December 16, 2021, second by Suminski. Motion carried 7-0.

Discussion and Approval of Draw#1 Façade Loan, 901 W. Bayfield St., Santa Leyenda Inmueble, LLC Applicant – Invoices totaling \$10,869.03 for work done on the property have been received. The work has been completed. Request is for payment up to \$10,000 for the approved loan amount. Anderson moved and Suminski seconded to approve payment of \$10,000. This will be the only draw on the loan. Anderson asked about electrical work. Greta Blancarte responded that no electrical work was done other than the replacement of the light fixtures. Motion carried 7-0.

Discussion and Action on Architectural, Site Plan, and Plan of Operation Approval for Expansion Project, I-1 Zoning District, Washburn Iron Works, 112 E. Bayfield Street, Taylor Pearson, Petitioner – Ketchum-Fish moved and Malcheski seconded to approve the Architectural Review and Site Plan with the justifications as drafted. Discussion occurred on the project and Pearson responded to questions. Motion carried 7-0.

Discussion on Draft Ordinance Change - Regulations of Outdoor Kitchen/Living Space - A draft ordinance was presented for further discussion. In discussion, Commission preferred to remove "patio" language and instead define "outdoor kitchen/living area" as an outdoor space with structures above grade or countertop level, used for cooking or food preparation. This would allow patios without a permit. Also requested to allow this use in the front yard with the primary structure setbacks. Kluver is to redraft and re-present.

Continued Discussion and Action on Comprehensive Plan Re-Write Project – Review of Land Use Maps and Policies – Jason Laumann from NWRPC was on-line and gave and update on where we are in the comprehensive plan process and the purpose of the comprehensive plan is. Discussion occurred on the current definition of "Planned Waterfront Special Development." Consensus to change that title to "Mixed Use Waterfront" instead. In the definition, add "may include public use" removed "master planned setting" and "high density." Laumann stated that he will assist with a new draft of this definition. Question asked if any other land use map changes desired. Suminski requested discussion of Cottage Commercial area from southern city boundary to 11th Avenue West. Discussion occurred on this. Motiff suggested a new land use category calling this the "Gateway" area. Laumann stated he will draft a definition of this as well.

Meeting adjourned at 7:42pm by Motiff.

1. Amend Chapter 13, Article 3 by including the following land use in Section 3-2 Land Use Definitions:

17.23.5 **Outdoor kitchen** An outdoor space with structures above grade or countertop level, used for cooking or food preparation. This use is strictly associated with a single-family residence as an accessory use.

2. Amend Chapter 13, Article 8, Exhibit 8-1 Land Use Matrix by inserting the following into the table:

3. Amend Chapter 13, Article 8, by inserting Section 9-543.5 to read as follows:

### 8-541.5 Outdoor kitchen

- (a) Location. An outdoor kitchen may be located in the front, side, and rear yard.
- (b) **Setbacks.** Any fixed improvement that constitutes a structure shall comply with the building setback requirements established for the zoning district in which the subject property is located.
- 4. Effective Date of Ordinance. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.

Hi Scott,

As a follow-up to the meeting last night, I'm providing my take on the discussion relative to the community gateway and waterfront mixed-use designations. Can you forward this to the Plan Commission for their review?

### **COMMUNITY GATEWAY**

The community gateway land use designation includes the area along Bayfield Street. Single- family residences are the predominant existing use in this area, but there are several existing commercial uses interspersed among the single-family residences. The comprehensive plan envisions that this area will continue to provide predominantly single-family residential uses, but it also envisions low-intensity commercial uses that are visually and functionally compatible with the existing neighborhood character. This designation encourages high-quality design for the land uses surrounding the Bayfield Street (STH 13) corridor to create a gateway that presents a positive image of the community for residents, businesses, and visitors.

### **WATERFRONT MIXED-USE**

The comprehensive plan recognizes Washburn's desire to reinforce the waterfront character of the community and to provide a vibrant economic environment. The waterfront area connecting East Omaha Street/Harbor View Drive is currently underutilized and represents a significant opportunity for community revitalization due to the available developable parcels of land, direct water access and exceptional views of Chequamegon Bay. This designation seeks to maintain existing water-related uses along the lakeshore while promoting mixed-use development which encourages private investment, promotes tourism, and increases the community tax base. Mixed-use is defined as a creative and cohesive blend of varied residential and non-residential land uses which are highly compatible with the existing character of the waterfront area. Mixed-use development proposals which integrate creative public use are strongly encouraged.

### Introducing Enabling Better Places: A User's Guide to Neighborhood Affordability

Curt Witynski, Deputy Executive Director, League of Wisconsin Municipalities





We are pleased to announce a new Wisconsin-specific League tool to help communities adjust their zoning code and remove obstacles to the development of more affordable housing. Last year, the League partnered with the Congress for the New Urbanism (CNU) and a broad group of Wisconsin organizations to develop a new guide for making small zoning changes to better enable the creation of more workforce and "missing middle" housing within a community.

The guide, Enabling Better Places: A User's Guide to Neighborhood Affordability will be posted to our website in mid-February here: https://lwm-info.org/1473/Housing

Municipal officials in Wisconsin, like community leaders across the nation, are struggling to make more affordable housing options available in their communities. The availability and pricing of housing is not meeting the needs of people working in jobs that are vital to the success of Wisconsin communities, such as: teachers, firefighters, small business owners, and service industry workers.

There are many reasons for a lack of affordable housing in Wisconsin communities. One cause that local policymakers can address is outdated local zoning regulations and policies that inadvertently restrict the housing market. Much of the existing housing stock in Wisconsin cities and villages consists of large, single-family homes which may not be affordable – or

practical – for the makeup of modern households. It is critical to make the process of adapting existing housing stock and building smaller and more varied housing easier.

The Enabling Better Places guide recommends a menu of changes to local zoning codes that Wisconsin communities should consider making and explains how best to accomplish the changes, including ways to convince a skeptical public. The guide includes tools to assist in the process of code reform such as sample ordinance language.

Examples of code changes the guide recommends include the following. Doing any of these will put your community in a better position for offering more housing options:

- Allow multi-unit housing as permitted uses in single-family zoning districts which have historically included two-family and multifamily.
- Realign lot widths and areas to match historic patterns favoring narrower lots.
- Reduce setbacks to historic distances to allow greater use of existing lots.
- Allow accessory dwellings by right for all single-family zoning districts.
- Permit residential uses within downtown and Main Street zoning districts.
- Permit residential uses, including multi-family, in commercial districts.
- Manage residential density with building types not units per acre in each district.
- Reduce or eliminate parking minimums.
- Assess and streamline the subdivision and workforce housing application process, including standards that direct development outcomes and a time limit on municipal response.

The afternoon session will be geared toward municipal planning staff and private planning consultants. You may attend both sessions.

The goal of the guide and the training is to show that bite-sized zoning code changes are possible and can have an immediate impact on removing obstacles to the development of workforce and missing middle housing.
